A bee's journey 2

Educate, prevent and address gender-based violence in international mobility projects

Creating safer and more inclusive mobility projects implies raising awareness on Gender-related dynamics, as well as strengthening our capacities to prevent, educate and deal with gender-based violence.

This training offers a space for youth workers involved in mobility projects to reflect on their practice, get inspired and develop competences to work with international groups of youth about gender-based violence.

Objectives

- Being more aware of our positioning and standing regarding gender-related topics : what place do I give to these questions in my practice?
- Developing sensitivity towards gender issues
- Exploring diverse understandings of concepts and words
- **Educating** : develop the capacity to organise learning activities on gender and gender-based violence, understand violence's mechanism
- **Preventing** : better identify risks and plan prevention activities in organisations working with youth at an international level
- **Addressing** : hold space for young people to be heard, understand the legal framework of gender-based violence in different national contexts, discuss different strategies on dealing with situations of violence, and identify the possibilities of support.

Participants' profile

This activity is designed to involve people with experience in **international mobility project management**. More specifically :

- Youth workers, project coordinators, trainers, mentors working on the implementation of Erasmus+ or European Solidarity Corps projects, or other educational mobility schemes.
- Who are able to participate fully in all activities in English.
- Who have a beginner level of experience in implementing gender-sensitive approaches in their projects but are eager to develop and implement gender-based approaches in their work.

Logistical information

The training will take place in a **youth hostel** in Marseille or in the surroundings. Participants will be accommodated in shared rooms (dorms). All the meals will be **vegetarian**, and the group will contribute to the community tasks (cooking, tidying-up...).

We will do our best to adapt the settings and program activities to support the participation of everyone, taking into account **specific needs** of each participant.

All the activities will be in **English**.

Trainer and ESC / E+ project coordinator. She participated in a five-month training program with the "Planning Familial" to become a sex education facilitator and be able to work with a wide audience (children, teenagers, adults). This training enabled her to address various topics and tools: the person-centered approach, risk reduction, sexual health, consent, discrimination based on gender or sexual orientation, and domestic and intra-family violence. She develops activities on feminism and gender-related issues as part of local and international projects.

Trainer and ESC/E+ project coordinator, studied gender studies at university and conducted research on gender equality in European volunteering projects. As part of the SALTO Training of Trainers, he developed learning activities for youth workers focused on preventing gender-based violence.
